Finance Report

Due to the diligence of our finance treasurer, Dennis Lins, our church just received a check for \$5760.94 as part of the Employee Reduction Program. Because of this, the General Fund is now a positive number, \$105.32. However, as the chart shows, \$27,069.62 should be available for all of the other funds.

If we subtract the bank balance as of 5/30/23 (\$18,902.29) from the amount needed, we still are behind \$8272.65 to fund all accounts. WE ARE STILL NOT IN A GOOD FINANCIAL SITUATION, but things are improving, thanks to the sacrificial giving of the congregation and the careful management by the finance committee.

In June the quarterly insurance is due for \$2,180.25. This is an increase over March of about \$300. If you feel moved to give to this cause, please label your gift, Extra Mile and it will be used to cover the cost of the insurance payment.




